LEPTIS MAGNA

Many people visit modern Rome to view the ancient buildings, statues, and streets left by the earlier Italians, the Romans. The Roman Empire in the West lasted until approximately 600 A.D. But it continued in the East as the Byzantine Empire lasting until 1453 with the fall of Constantinople. With the decline of the Rome in the West a number of former Roman cities also declined, one in particular of great interest is *Leptis Magna* in Libya. It is a fascinating city because its citizens slowly abandoned it at the same time as the empire declined and it has remained buried in the sand since then.

In its heyday it had a population of approximately two-hundred thousand. With the absence of residents, the arid sandy environment buried the city where it remained covered for hundreds of years. The City dates back to 1100 B.C. and became a Roman city in 200 B.C. The city was so Romanized that *Septimius Severus*, a native son of *Leptis Magna* became the Emperor of the Roman Empire in 193. *Septimius* favored his city above all others and lavished much money in bringing about changes. Among the changes he introduced were a new forum, new theaters, and new docks. The harbor had a tendency to silt up, but, his changes made matters worse instead of better. Since the eastern part of the wharves was seldom ever used, they remained in excellent condition.

The ruins of the city are located in *Khoms*, Libya, 81 miles east of Tripoli. The site is one of the most spectacular and unspoiled Roman ruins in the Mediterranean.

In the Roman Forum in Rome, there are three arches on the *Via Sacra*, looking from the *Tabularium*, which was the library, the first arch one see is that of *Septimius Severus*, the next is the Arch of *Titus*, which contains a carving of soldiers carrying the loot taken from the Temple in Jerusalem –The Menorah, and the third arch, close to the Coliseum, is that of *Constantine*. This arch since it is not in the enclosed area of the Forum, but out in the open for anyone to walk around, take pictures, and put it to good use, such that many a marital rite take place under the arch.

In *Leptis Magna* there is an arch to *Septimius*, which, because sand covered it, it has been completely preserved. The people of the city also built an arch to commemorate Emperor Trajan because he classified the city as a *colonia*, thereby, anyone born there was a Roman Citizen. It too is in excellent condition, as the following photographs attest.

On the left is the arch of *Septimius* in *Leptis Magna* and on the right is the main gate to the city. Many fascinating photographs are available for viewing on the internet. Just insert *Leptis Magna* in your search bar and surf.

Note: I've mentioned previously Vincent Cannato the author of the book I highly recommend everyone to read, *American Passage: A History of Ellis Island*, will be making a presentation at the Library on Friday October 9, 2015 at 2:00PM

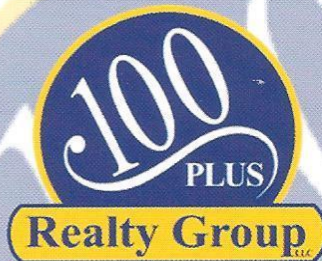
